

Tale of Two Rivers: The Tri-Cities, Washington (Richland, Kennewick, Pasco) 2-Day Itinerary

Day 1 - History at the Confluence

Morning – Arrival & Orientation

- · Arrive in the Tri-Cities (Richland, Kennewick, Pasco).
- · Start your journey with coffee and a river walk along the Columbia for crisp autumn views.

Midday – Sacajawea Historical State Park

- Explore the very site where the Corps of Discovery camped on October 17–18, 1805.
- · Visit the Sacajawea Interpretive Center to learn about the Columbia Plateau tribes and the expedition's journey.
- Walk through the Story Circles, an outdoor art installation designed by Maya Lin, celebrating Native culture, natural history, and the confluence of the Snake and Columbia rivers.

Evening – Dinner with a View

- Enjoy fresh Northwest cuisine at a riverside restaurant in Pasco or Kennewick.
- · Catch the sunset where two mighty rivers meet (Columbia and Snake) —golden light reflecting off the autumn landscape.

Day 2 – Museums & Modern Stories

Morning – The REACH Museum

• Explore exhibits on Ice Age floods, Columbia Basin geology, and Lewis & Clark's passage.

Afternoon – Wine & Harvest Flavors

- Discover why the Tri-Cities is at the heart of Washington Wine Country.
- · Visit nearby vineyards and tasting rooms for autumn pours surrounded by colorful vineyard rows.

Evening – Riverfront Relaxation

- Unwind with a casual stroll at Howard Amon Park in Richland.
- Dine locally, perhaps pairing regional wines with farm-to-table dishes.
