Did You Know?

 Lewis & Clark noted that **Native American tribes prized bald eagle feathers** for ceremonial use

- Wingspan: **6–7½ feet**
- Eyesight: **5–6x stronger than humans**
- Can lift **3–5 pounds**
- Primarily fish-eaters, always near water
- **Often mate for life**

 **Two Rivers National Wildlife Refuge**  **Brussels, Illinois**

Some of the **largest wintering concentrations of bald eagles in the Lower 48** gather along the Mississippi and Illinois Rivers.

- ✓ 500+ eagles counted near the river confluence
- ✓ Peak season: October through early spring
- ✓ Several nesting pairs remain year-round

Loess Bluffs National Wildlife Refuge **Forest City, Missouri**

Winter brings massive flocks of waterfowl—and bald eagles follow.

- ✓ 300+ bald eagles during peak migration
- ✓ Record 662 eagles counted in 2020
- ✓ Diverse wetland and grassland habitats

Boyer Chute National Wildlife Refuge **Fort Calhoun, Nebraska**

- ✓ Look along the Missouri River and the chute itself

- ✓ Refuge closed to protect birds
- ✓ Viewing available from Eagle Drive and Fort Randall Dam
